

Radiology Health Services Research Seed Grant Application

2008 - 2009

Deadline: September 19, 2008

Background

The Department of Radiology, Health Services Research Section will award a limited number of seed grants to members of the Department of Radiology to support Health Services Research. The grants are intended to enable research that will serve as pilot work leading to larger extramurally supported grant funding. Grant funding may be used to support research expenses, including personnel, supplies, and equipment, but not including faculty salary support. Grant awards will be up to \$15,000. The seed grants are for a maximum of two years.

Applicants are strongly encouraged to discuss potential grant applications with members of the health services research section well in advance of the deadline. Consultation meetings with the Health Services Research Section can be arranged prior to the submission date, and may aid completion of a successful grant.

Eligibility Requirements

The principle investigator must be a faculty member at the Acting Assistant Professor level or higher, with either a permanent appointment in the Department of Radiology or a letter of support from the Chairman indicating the intention to be hired into a permanent position. Applications from junior faculty are especially encouraged.

Health Services Research in Radiology includes:

- 1) Studies of the impact of radiological techniques on diagnostic confidence.
- 2) Studies of the impact of radiological techniques on medical decision making, including the choice of therapy or further diagnostic work-up
- 3) Studies of the effect of radiological techniques on patient outcomes (e.g. survival, morbidity)
- 4) Studies that measure the work flow, utilization, cost, or cost-effectiveness of radiological techniques (e.g. operations research, prediction rules, cost and outcomes)
- 5) Studies addressing access to radiology services

Application Review

Grant applications will be peer reviewed, with award decisions made within two months of the application deadline.

Reporting

This award is targeted for projects that can be carried out in two years or less. A progress report is required at approximately one year from the time the grant is awarded. A final report presentation will be required at the completion of the grant.

Deadline

Description of the project is limited to 3 pages and must be received by 5:00 pm on the submission deadline (September 19th). Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.
